



Arthur Milo Pattison

Arthur Milo Pattison was born in Ottawa on October 4, 1940 to Carman and Bernice (nee Jones) Pattison. Following graduation from Nepean High School, he enrolled in Carleton University, Ottawa, and obtained a Bachelor of Science, and after graduating from teachers' college, taught school for a few years in the 1960s.

Active as a young man in the Presbyterian Young Peoples' Society, Art was also involved in Christian camps. He and Freda were married in 1966, and two years later moved to Toronto for theological studies. Art graduated from Knox College in 1971 with the college diploma and was ordained and inducted into the then two-point charge of Essa Road Church, Barrie, and Stroud Church, Stroud, Ontario on September 14, 1971 by the Presbytery of Barrie.

On February 4, 1974, Art was appointed as Assistant to the Minister of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, where he served until the position was eliminated on December 31, 1975. He returned to teaching math and science in local high schools until his retirement.

He continued to serve various congregations in providing pulpit supply as opportunities were offered, and for a time served as interim moderator for Calvin Hungarian Church, Ottawa during a vacancy.

In latter years, he worshipped with various Christian congregations, including St. Paul's Church, Ottawa, where he participated in a Bible study group, and at Parkwood Church, Ottawa.

Predeceased by his wife Freda in 2011, Art is survived by their four children: Peter (Jennifer), Christina (Trent), Rebecca (Adam), and Paul (Diana), and seven grandchildren: Lauren, Megan, Neeve, Emily, Simon, Liam and Sophie; and also by his sister Carol.
